UCCS Compass General Education Curriculum

A general education curriculum required for all students is common at most colleges and universities. General education helps to provide college graduates with a core set of skills and experiences no matter their degree choices. We believe that all students at UCCS will benefit from the curriculum and will find the skills they develop useful in whatever path they follow after graduation.

The <u>UCCS Compass General Education</u> program is based on nation-wide best practices and on recommendations from the American Association of Colleges and Universities. The UCCS Compass program is intentional in integrating <u>high-impact practices</u> shown to promote learning and college success. Our curriculum reflects the most recent research into the skills that matter to employers such as the AAC&U's report on "<u>How College Contributes to Workforce Success.</u>"

The requirements for each student will vary somewhat based on your major and previous experience. The best way to see the requirements for you is to check your <u>Degree Audit</u>. You should also find time to discuss the requirements with your <u>Academic Advisor</u> and get their feedback and insight.

If you enter UCCS with transfer credits, AP/IB scores, or a previous degree, they should apply to your requirements already. You can check the degree audit to see if they are applying! If you think you have already met a requirement through previous coursework or other relevant experiences (for instance, military service or technical education), you should begin by talking with your Academic Advisor. You can also check the specific <u>transfer policies on our website!</u> The table below lists the core requirements for all students, and when most students complete them (early, in the middle, or late in their time in college)
